Liebe Schüler,

Wilkommen in 10. Klasse Deutsch! Welcome to Year 10 German.

Congratulations on making the transition to Senior Language Studies. You will find a big difference in the way German is taught in the Senior School. In order to get the most out of this course, and to prepare you for 2013, I strongly suggest that you do the following throughout the year.

- 1. Carefully read the summary notes to help you understand and plan for **what will be expected of you.**
- 2. Remember with anything in life "you only get out what you put in."
- 3. **Revise** past grammar, topics and vocabulary (especially throughout the summer holidays). Place particular evidence on *modal verbs, the perfect (past) tense, adjective endings and sentence structure.*
- 4. You must complete homework by the due date. Develop **regular study routines** so you don't leave work until the last minute. 4 x 20 minute blocks **as a minimum** are required entering into Year 10 German.
- 5. Review any **feedback and analyse** your work. In Senior German you must become competent with proof reading and editing your work.
- 6. Always ask gyestions and seek guidance when required.
- 7. **Read and listen** to German texts on the Internet.
- 8. **Practise** your writing skills and see in which areas you have difficulties, so that we can fix these in class. You can learn from making mistakes. Diary entries and summaries of work, plus practice exercises, can often help build your vocabulary and improve your writing abilities
- 9. **Practise speaking aloud**. Teach your family about the work you are doing, or try using vocabulary at home. Translate what you are speaking about to your family.

Outcome Tasks - VELS

On completion of this subject, students must demonstrate that they can:

- Use a range of strategies to extract information from a variety of extended complex listening texts.
- Communicate information in translation and interpretation activities conveying differences in meaning and intent.

- Draft and edit extended texts in handwritten and electronic form, identify and use appropriate grammar and punctuation.

Apart from the completion of Outcome Tasks, each week you will be asked to respond to a number of tasks. It is the responsibility of the student to ensure that all tasks be completed. Some tasks will be Self Assessment and will be not be collected by me, however these tasks must be still be completed in your folder. The completion of classwork may be used in the decision to award a Satisfactory or Non-Satisfactory result for Outcome Tasks. Inability to complete classwork may be grounds for an 'N-grade' being awarded for this subject.

If you are absent for absent for any class it is the responsibility of \underline{YOU} to catch up with work \underline{prior} to your return to this class.

Overdue work will also be noted to the Year Level Manager and students will be expected to catch up on any overdue work. Failure to do so may lead to an N being awarded for this subject

Work Book & Notes:

You are required to maintain a workbook throughout this Unit. It is recommended that you use a **loose-leaf** folder in Year 10 German. Subject Dividers/Tabs should be used to separate the Areas of Study and preparation for exams.

This will enable the student to develop knowledge and understanding of, for example, historical issues and everyday life experienced by East Germans. Three texts will form the basis of this study, which may include feature films, short films, short stories, songs, newspaper articles, electronic texts, documentaries, music, painting and oral histories. The length of texts selected will vary depending on the type of text, its density and level of complexity.
